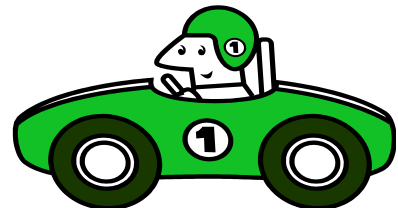
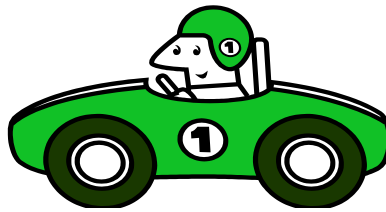

## **ATTENTION LICENSED STUDENT DRIVERS**

Safe Teen Driving Initiative: The Coral Springs Police Department will once again recognize local teenagers who go without a traffic citation or an "at-fault" accident during the school year as part of their Safe Driving Teen Initiative. Teenagers must submit a copy of their driving record that indicates they have a valid Florida Driver's License between the dates of August 23, 2010, to April 1, 2011. 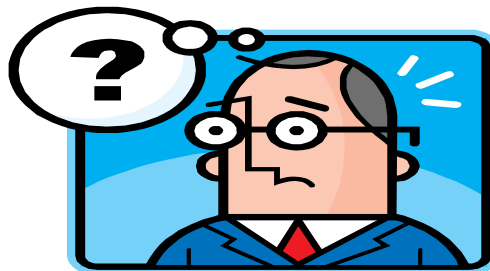

We cannot guarantee your first choice selection for sessions.** Seating will be limited. Therefore, early registration is imperative. A confirmation letter (which will serve as an admission ticket) and directions to the site will be emailed upon receipt of registration and payment. Your student will need to provide his/her own transportation to the event. Breakfast and lunch may be purchased on site. Registered students absent on the day of the review will not receive refunds.
