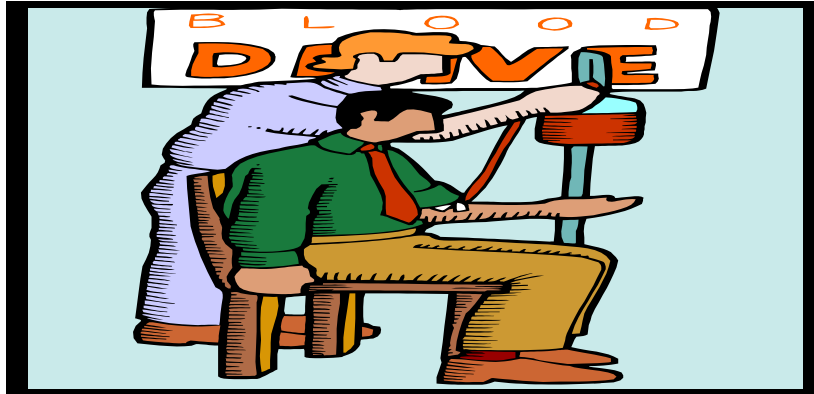

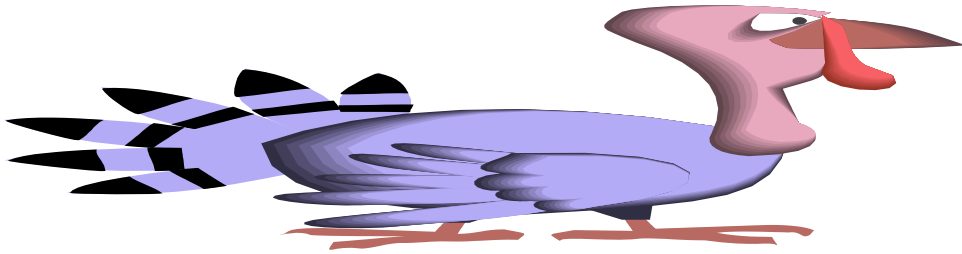

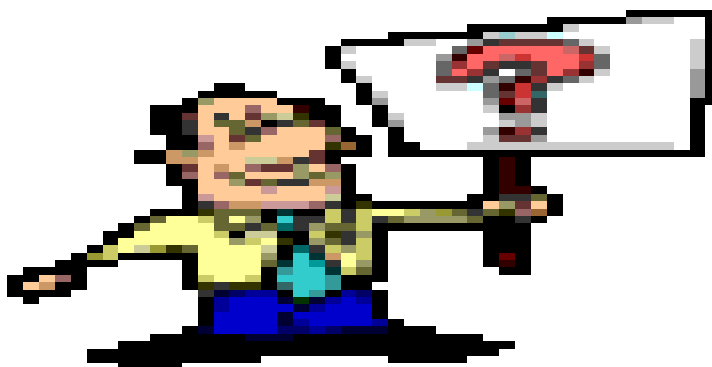

### TRUTH OR CONSEQUENCES

So what IS the truth about uniform pants and shorts? Well here is the “dish....”

The truth is that according to current Coral Springs Charter School (CSCS) policy, a student must attend school everyday with the proper uniform shirt, pants or shorts, shoes and ID. Three years ago our School Advisory Council (SAC) passed a requirement to have CSCS students purchase all school uniforms from the CSCS School Store. This was an effort to clarify which Dickies® brand pants or shorts style numbers had been approved for the official CSCS student uniform. Since the Dickies® brand is available nationally via multiple retailers and has many different style numbers, this decision was made to make the process of uniform purchasing simpler and more convenient for our students and parents.

### **Did You Know...?**

The CSCS School Store actually offers the approved school uniform styles for much lower prices than other retailers.

If you can't handle the truth, here are the consequences for not wearing an approved CSCS school uniform:

5 <sup>th</sup> Offense:	Saturday Detention
6 <sup>th</sup> Offense or More:	Administrative Action

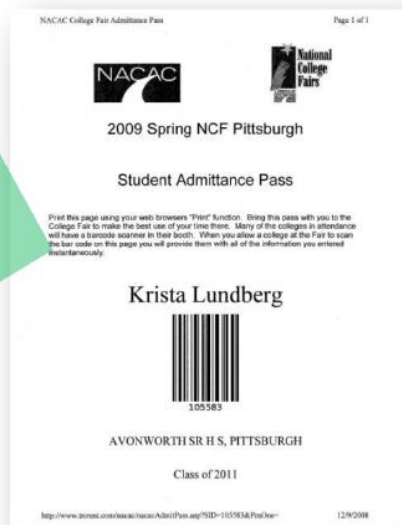
