Dear Parents and Students,

Welcome to the 2010-2011 school year! We have had an incredible opening to this school year. I feel that our faculty, staff and students are more excited and energized as they prepare to challenge each other every day. During the first week of school, we were able to recognize last year's accomplishments in our grade-level assemblies. These assemblies provided us the opportunity to reward over 1000 students for their FCAT and AP performance. The money for this comes from the Principal's Discretionary Account, the PTSO and the students' share of the FCAT bonus.

We are also excited that our extra-curricular activities have begun. I encourage you to have your children become involved in an activity or service club. We want to maintain a culture that will develop well-rounded students who are able to work as a team and to value community service.

Academically, we are continually seeking innovative methods to ensure your child's success. Within the next couple of weeks, our students will take their first Benchmark Assessment. These assessments are extremely important because they help school staff identify any gaps in learning that our students may have. The results from this will then allow us to create a daily Instructional Focus to begin closing these gaps. Ultimately, we expect this to lead our students to perform at an optimum level on any standardized test, including the FCAT. As many of you already know, our ultimate goal is to have all our students achieve mastery of the Sunshine State Standards.

As for our students, I am expecting 100% accountability when it comes to making every effort to perform at high standards in the classroom. This includes completing assignments, studying and maintaining good attendance. Should your child need any assistance, our teachers offer extra help on a regular basis, and our Extended Day Program will begin later in the fall for students who need additional help to prepare for the FCAT.

Please also make plans to attend our Open House on Tuesday, September 14th from 5-7 PM. The format will remain the same as last year. Parents are invited to come at any time during the scheduled 5-7 PM time period to meet the teachers. For our new 6th grade parents, the Open House is a time to simply meet your child's teachers and to put "a face to the name"; it is not a time for extended conversation with the teachers. The teachers will have handouts regarding their classes and a sheet for parents to sign for a conference, if needed. Finally, please also consider staying for the PTSO meeting in the cafeteria immediately following the Open House!

NATIONAL JUNIOR HONOR SOCIETY

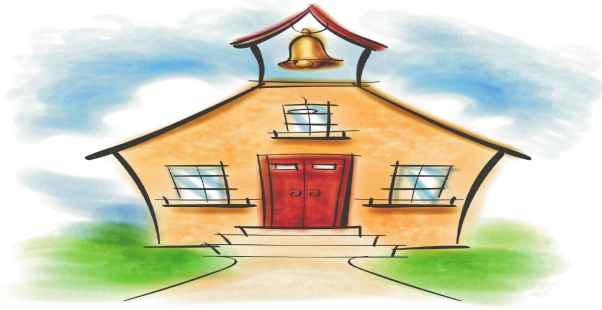
To be considered for membership in NJHS, each inductee must have 30 hours of community service completed. Please start getting your service hours done.

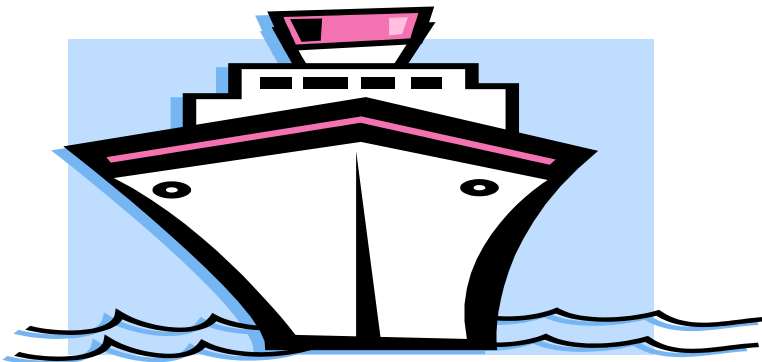


6TH GRADE END OF THE YEAR FIELD TRIP

MINDS IN MOTION

Childhood obesity leads to many health problems such as diabetes, high blood pressure, cholesterol problems and many other ailments. Overweight children are likely to grow up and become overweight adults. With the trend of ever increasing childhood inactivity is an increase in the incidence of neurological disorders in children such as attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD), autism, and other psychosomatic disorders.

Coral Springs Charter School is implementing an after-school academic pilot program this year. The purpose of the Minds In Motion program is to incorporate low-intensity aerobic exercise with educational instruction. Students will utilize the fitness room twice per week after school for 30 minutes each. The fitness room includes 5 treadmills and 4 stationary bicycles for participants to use while watching and interacting with an instructional video/DVD and the facilitator (the Teacher). The videos are content-based with regards to test-taking strategies and include Reading & Math.

We are currently seeking financial support to aid in the expansion and implementation and would like assistance from parents and community members to incorporate more exercise equipment in the fitness room so that we can add more students to the program. Also, we would like to attach current touch-screen technology to each machine in the fitness room so that each student is able to utilize a customized curriculum tailored to his/her individual academic needs.

All students who do not meet the passing FCAT score may continue to retake this test an unlimited number of times. However, if after taking the test and still not passing, a student may substitute an ACT or SAT test score with an equivalent passing score to meet this requirement. NURSES' NOTES

Sixth grade is where Broward County has us do the following screenings: vision, hearing, BMI and scoliosis. There will be a form sent home asking families if they do not want any or all of these done. If there is a screening you DO NOT want you can return the form saying which or all you DO NOT want your child to have. If do want the screenings you DO NOT NEED to return the form.

If you would like to help with screenings by getting certified to do either hearing or vision testing you can contact me to sign up to attend the following workshops. You will get 5 volunteer hours for the class and then can get volunteers hours when you come in to help with the screenings. Vision Screening Classes will be offered from 8:30- 1 pm @ Plantation Community Center, 555 Palm Tree Road Plantation (maps will be provided once you are signed up). Attention Middle School Parents:

During the first days of school, teachers will communicate their expectations for behavior in the classroom. A code of conduct is sent home for parents to read and discuss with their children. Since many of our students visit the library after school, they will also be expected to follow the library's code of conduct, which was included in the CSCS First Day Packet. It is unfortunate that due to some disrespectful and disruptive behavior by individual students last year, that the library staff will be far more diligent at enforcing this code. The consequences are progressive:

First: A verbal warning and reminder of the specific expectation.

Second: If the inappropriate behavior is repeated, the student will be told to leave for the day. The student's name and behavior will be noted on a list kept by the library.

Third: If the student continues to violate same rule, they will be given a 30 day suspension.

Fourth: If the same problem continues when the student returns, he/she will be given 90 day suspension and may be suspended permanently.

The library is a public building, and our students need to understand that they are sharing the building with other members of our community. The staff aims to encourage behavior that supports the library's mission to provide the best possible resources in a welcoming environment *for all*. We are very fortunate to have the services of the library so close by. Students should strive not to abuse the privilege.

If you are the parent of a student who needs to stay at the library after school, it is highly recommended that you review and discuss this code with your child. Here is a summary of expectations:

To access the library's computers, all students must have a valid Broward County Library card and bring it with them each time they visit the library. If your child is under age 18 and does not have his/her own library card, you will need to accompany your minor to any Broward County Library, fill out an application, show proof of Broward County residency with current address and produce a photo ID. (Pick-up time is an ideal time to come in and assist your child in getting a card.)

When picking up your child up at the library after school, please remember that you must park your car and then go to meet your child. The fire lane in front of the library cannot be used as a waiting area. Coral Springs Police may ticket violators.

Inappropriate use of library computers includes damaging, altering or tampering with equipment or software, or using multiple library cards to make computer reservations.

Cell phones must be put on vibrate or silenced and used only in designated cell phone areas.

Rude, abusive and disrespectful language will not be tolerated.

Threatening behavior and fighting will not be tolerated.

Students are not permitted to loiter near the front doors and windows, climb trees, play ball, skateboard or ride bicycles on the grounds of the library or the parking lot. Students may not lean on the glass in front of the library. A decision needs to be made whether to come in, work or read or participate in a program.

Groups reserving quiet study rooms will need to supply names of all group members. If one student in the group is asked to leave, the entire group may be asked to leave.

Behavior becomes unacceptable when it interferes with customer use or causes damage or injury to people, buildings or equipment. Students unable to comply with the Code will be asked to leave or for serious offenses, banned.

The Broward County Library has the authority to contact the Coral Springs Police Department if students violate the Library's Customer Code of Conduct, and when students do not comply with directives given by library staff.

In short, the library should be used as a library, and is not intended to offer child care. Library staff cannot assume the responsibility for the care or supervision of unattended children inside or outside the library. The library manager welcomes any questions about Library policies. In an effort to raise student achievement for those students who scored a **one** or a **two** on the 2010 FCAT, Coral Springs Charter School is offering remediation courses in reading, math, science and writing through our Extended Day Program (EDP).
