Dear Parents and Students,

Despite the delay of school caused by Tropical Storm Fay, our students have settled into their class schedules and our extra-curricular activities are in full swing. By the time you read this newsletter, our students will have taken their first Benchmark Assessment. These assessments are extremely important because they help school staff identify any gaps in learning our students may have. We then have the opportunity, through the daily Instructional Focus, to begin closing these gaps. Our students are then able to perform at an optimum on any standardized test, including the FCAT. As many of you already know, our ultimate goal is to have all our students achieve mastery of the Sunshine State Standards. In that vein I am happy to report that out of the 1200+ students who took the FCAT last spring, 795 students received a monetary reward at their class assemblies for their achievement on the FCAT. The rewards were made possible through the principal's discretionary fund, the PTSO and the students' FCAT award money from the 2007/08 school year. In addition, as part of my commitment for the achievement of the "A" grade for the fifth year in a row, I did indeed celebrate with a sky dive on August 2nd. It was a very scary experience, but also very thrilling as well.

Please make plans to attend our Open House on Tuesday, September 9th from 5-7 PM. The format will remain the same as last year. Parents are invited to come at any time during the scheduled 5-7 PM time period to meet the teachers. For our new 6th grade parents the Open House is a time to simply meet your child's teachers and to put "a face to the name." It is not a time for conferencing or an extended conversation with the teachers. The teachers will have handouts regarding their classes and a sheet for parents to sign up for a conference if needed. Finally, please also consider staying for the PTSO meeting in the cafeteria immediately following the Open House!

Finally, did you know 2008-09 is the tenth year of existence for Coral Springs Charter? Yes, it has been ten years since the first group of students walked through our doors to begin their journey of learning at a charter school. In the months ahead information will be forthcoming regarding our celebration of this auspicious anniversary!

The School Advisory Committee (SAC) will be holding elections for the 2008-2009 school year on Monday, September 15, 2008 at 7:00 p.m. in the CSCS cafeteria. If you are interested in running for a board position, please attend the September 15 meeting.

CAFETERIA NEWS

Breakfast is served daily from 7:00 a.m - 7:20 am at a cost of \$2.80. All students who are eligible for free lunch also get breakfast at no cost. Reduced eligible pay only .30 cents for breakfast. We are now following the Broward School Food and Nutrition Services Menu. In order to stay on a full Breakfast menu offering HOT Breakfast we must average 100 meals served daily at breakfast. Lunch Prices.....Middle \$3.60 and High \$3.75. We do not allow charging privileges so students please Pre Pay in Cash or Check (made payable to CSCS) for the week or month. Students must know and use their meal account numbers when making any purchases from the cafe.

We encourage ALL students to complete a Meals Benefits form and return to Mr. Martin in the Main Office.

NURSE'S NOTES

Welcome back to our returning students and a special hello to all our new students and parents. Those of you who assisted with screenings last year, I have been unable to pull your contact information from my computer and therefore ask that you please call, stop by or email me your numbers.



It is my pleasure to take care of your children. As a reminder students are not allowed to carry medication but there is a policy for distribution of medication. You must have a doctor fill out the form and return it to the school with the medication. All prescription medication needs to be in the medication bottle as it comes from the pharmacy. All over the counter medication i.e. Tylenol, Motrin must be in the original container. I can not accept pills or liquids any other way. Medication forms are available in the clinic. Students may not bring in the medication it must be brought in by an adult.

If you would like to get some volunteer hours by donating items to the clinic, you can bring in water, Gatorade (in individual bottles please), juice boxes, as well as snacks like breakfast bars, snack bags, cereal bars etc. and include your name and store receipt. You can receive one hour of volunteer time for each ten dollars spent. I will not be able to track amounts so I suggest that all donation amounts be at least ten dollars. You can also help in the clinic from 7:30 am to 9:00 am before I arrive. If you are interested please call or email

I will let you know, if I have your contact information, when classes for hearing and vision certification will be held. Welcome to a new school year! For those of you who are new to our school, we want you to know how fortunate we are to have the resources of the Northwest Regional Library at our disposal. Mrs. Martin is our library media specialist. She works with the library staff to arrange class visits during the school day, and assists students who visit after school. All students will need a Broward Library card to use the computers and check out materials. If your child already has a card, please accompany him/her to the circulation desk to get a new card, or check on the status of an older card. With a parent along, students will be able to get a card right away.

Because we are sharing the library with the public, students need to understand that their afterschool behavior is a reflection of our school. We want the community to think well of Coral Springs Charter. As part of the greater community, students need to be respectful of the staff and other library users. If your child needs to spend time in the library after school, please discuss with them your expectations for behavior in a public place. When you stop in to visit, please ask a staff member for a copy of the Library Code of Conduct to review.

The library offers Homework Help from 4 to 6 PM, and other activities right after school. Please check the schedule at the end of this article. Also, please note that the library hours have changed (see below).

Dear Parents:

The Broward County Board of Commissioners and the Coral Springs City Commissioners entered into a partnership agreement in 2000 to provide library service to the students of the Coral Springs Charter School. The Northwest Regional Library, located adjacent to the Charter School, opened in February of 2001 and has since served as a joint-use public library and middle/high school library.

We are very pleased that your child has convenient access to library services and information and is able to use the library during the school day with his/her teacher and after school hours to research school assignments. Librarians in the Youth Services/Teen area and Computer Center on the first floor and in the Reference section on the second floor will be glad to assist your child with his/her research or recreational needs.

Effective August 1, the hours of operation for the Northwest Regional Library have changed. The new schedule is:

Sunday 1 pm – 5 pm

Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday 10 am – 8 pm

Thursday, Friday, Saturday 10 am – 6 pm

We want to remind you that the Broward County Library has a Customer Code of Conduct for library customers, including students, which is intended to encourage behavior that supports the library's mission to provide the best possible resources in a welcoming environment. Behavior becomes unacceptable when it interferes with this mission, impinges on customer use or causes damage or injury to people, buildings or equipment. Those willing to modify unacceptable behavior are welcome to remain in the library, however, those unable to comply will be asked to leave. Cell phones must be put on vibrate and used only in designated cell phone areas. Inappropriate use of library computers including damaging, altering or tampering with equipment or software is prohibited.

Customers, including all students who do not abide by library rules will be asked to leave the library and may be suspended from the library if the disruptions continue to occur or are serious in nature. Broward County Library also has the authority to contact the Coral Springs Police if customers violate the Library's Customer Code of Conduct. Thank you for your cooperation.

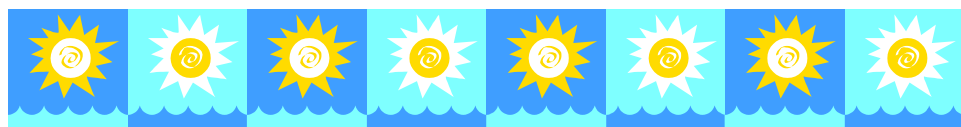
Sept. 10 – Teen Movie Night with soda and popcorn. Ages 12-18. 4-6 pm.

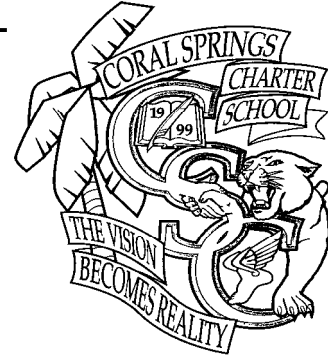

The program begins **October 6th** and will run concurrently with the school calendar until the week before FCAT testing in March.
